Academy of Management Perspectives (AMP), the leading academic publication (Impact factor – 8.069, 5-Year Impact Factor – 10.161, ABS – 4, ABDC – A) linking management theory with policy implications, will be cohosting a PDW at Ivey Business School (Western University) on March 31st.

The PDW is open to academics and doctoral students interested in generating research and papers at the intersection of theory and policy. No previous publishing experience or papers in progress required. As AMP publishes papers from across the management spectrum including organizational behavior/human relations, strategy, entrepreneurship, international business, innovation, business economics, etc. this PDW is open to scholars in all Management domains.

The PDW will be held primarily in person, though one-way (e.g., no interaction) Zoom will be available for those unable to attend in person.

AMP currently has 9 active special issue call for papers (see below), and this is an ideal opportunity for those interested in these calls to interact with AMP editors, ask questions, develop their skills towards writing AMP style papers, and network with authors similarly interested in publishing in this journal. It is expected that the AMP editors and guest editors will be available throughout the day to meet authors in an informal capacity, however these interactions cannot be guaranteed as travel schedules and subsequent availability are likely to vary.

Further, there will be a special paper development workshop for the Exceptionalism and Outliers SI held in the afternoon. Attendees are not required to attend this session if they are not interested in doing so.

It is expected that authors attending this PDW will receive valuable information that will assist and develop their writing for AMP. However, attending these sessions will neither guarantee acceptance, nor special treatment, to papers submitted to AMP or the special issues.

AMP articles leverage management theory to understand contemporary behavioral, socioeconomic, and technological trends, highlighting their implications for the public interest or relying on a strong evidence base of empirical findings to inform public policy. Authors develop connections between management evidence and public policy concerns by (i) critically assessing the impact of management theory and research on public policy; (ii) summarizing empirical evidence to emphasize their policy implications; (iii) identifying policy concerns that should motivate the development of new management theory and research; and/or (iv) establishing a research agenda that informs public policy.
